## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, certain areas of the Township of Farmington, Tioga County, Pennsylvania, are subject to periodic flooding (and/or mud slides) from streams, causing serious damages to properties within these areas, and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Board of Township
Supervisors of the township aforesaid to require the recognition
and evaluation of flood and/or mud slide hazards in all official
actions relating to land use in the flood plain (and/or mud slide)
areas having special flood (and/or mud slide) hazards, and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures and to reduce future flood losses pursuant to the Second Class Township Code of Pennsylvania,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board of Township Supervisors hereby:

- 1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force for those areas having flood or mud slide hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and
- 2. Vests the Township Secretary with the responsibility, authority, and means to:
- (a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the area having special flood (and/or mud slide) hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.
- (b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain

(and/or mud slide area).

- (c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain or mud slide areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain and/or mudslide areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
- (d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of flood plain (and/or mud slide area) management measures.
- 3. Appoints the Township Secretary to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest floor is below grade on one or more sides, the elevation of the floor immediately above must also be recorded.
- 4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.
